Academic Year | October 2018 - June 2019

School year sessions take place meet on first and third Saturdays every month, 11am – 3pm. Field trips will have extended hours.

Summer Intensive | July 8 - August 8, 2019

Summer sessions meet Monday - Thursday from 11am - 3pm. Field trips will have extended hours.
