Dia Teens is a collective made up of fifteen young people based at Dia:Beacon who collaborate with each other to create original projects, engage with their local community, and travel to New York City arts spaces. Working closely with a practicing artist, teens make, experiment, question, and investigate contemporary art and explore questions related to art and the world.

This year-round program is **FREE** for all participants. Lunches, snacks, materials, and in-program transportation is provided for all sessions. No previous art classes or special skills required.

2018-19 Program Calendar

Dia Teens is a **year-round** program. Accepted students commit to participating in the summer intensive *and* the following school year. Please look closely at the two schedules below to make sure that you are able to commit to both.

Summer Intensive | July 9 – August 9, 2018

Summer sessions meet Monday – Thursday from 11am – 3pm. Field trips will have extended hours.

Academic Year | October 2018 – June 2019

School year sessions take place meet on first and third Saturdays every month, 11am – 3pm. Field trips will have extended hours.

This program is **FREE** for teens. Financial assistance for public transportation to and from Dia:Beacon is provided upon request.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Applicants must be currently enrolled in high school, and have completed at least one full year of high school.
- New applicants must commit to participating for one full year (summer and school year).
- Participants must attend every session unless prior arrangements are made. Please review the schedule to make sure that you are available for all of the sessions.
- Preference given to Hudson Valley residents.

Please note: *Consent of parent or guardian is required for all program participants under 18 years of age.*
